Don't be afraid of clouds

There can be clouds of discouragement and suffering in our lives as well, circumstances that temporarily blot out the sunlight of God's love for us. You may have such a cloud hanging over your life right now. You may be in a hospital bed, or suffering discouragement, fear, despair or bereavement.


Have you ever noticed that sometimes, when you board a plane, the sky is like a thick grey ceiling? It looks impenetrable. But the plane does not hesitate – it climbs steadily onward and upward straight into the cloud. And what happens? Nothing! The cloud cannot block your progress, it must give way before you.

The simple truth is, you may not be able to see through clouds, but you can go through them. The plane uses navigational aids for guidance, and we have the Holy Spirit to guide us through the darkest times. And finally, we emerge through the cloudbank, and there before us is a sun-drenched sky of blue and golden glory, far above the dismal and disappointing things far below.

Whatever cloud is hanging over you at present, whether suffering, discouragement, fear, there IS something you can do about it NOW. Pray – pour out your heart to the Lord about it. He has promised that His grace will be sufficient for anything that we encounter in this life.

And – look up. Look towards heaven, think beyond those clouds, and remember His promise that the sufferings we may be undergoing here are nothing compared to the glory that God has prepared for us there.



Loneliness in young people - A Boys' Brigade study

Young people in the UK are feeling more lonely, and yet are less likely to have a stable relationship or friendship than they did, even a decade ago.

So finds the Boys Brigade, which carried out an extensive study as part of its recent 140th anniversary events.

Almost half of the young people questioned admitted that they were in regular mental distress, and yet had had no medical diagnosis or treatment.

Rates of self-harm, disability, and obesity have also gone up. One in every seven young people is even unhappy with their appearance.

The study, Youth Culture and Trends also found that the shift to spending more time online with others, rather than in face-to-face relationships, mirrors a reported decline in the satisfaction with friendships and rise in loneliness.



A Letter from the Provincial Board - Br Fred Linyard

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

It is with sadness that I write to notify you of the death of Br Fred Linyard, who passed into higher service in the early hours of this morning.

We celebrate a life lived in service to Christ. Following completion of his training at Fairfield Moravian College and Moravian Theological Seminary, Br Linyard was called to serve Saint Peter's Moravian Church in Bedford in 1954. He went on to serve in the Yorkshire district. In 1962, alongside his late wife, Sr Olive Linyard, he was called to Jamaica. He was minister in Bethabara and later Trinity, Kingston as well as Moravian tutor for the United Theological College of the West Indies. Returning to the British Province in 1973, he continued his ministry in Ockbrook and Leicester congregations before taking office on the Provincial Board and British Mission Board in 1976. During his time on the Board, he also served Harold Road. He retired in 1994 to the Midlands District and further contributed as the editor of the Moravian Messenger until 2008.

Details of funeral arrangements will be communicated in touch course. We keep his whole family in prayer during this time.
